## Courtyard Café

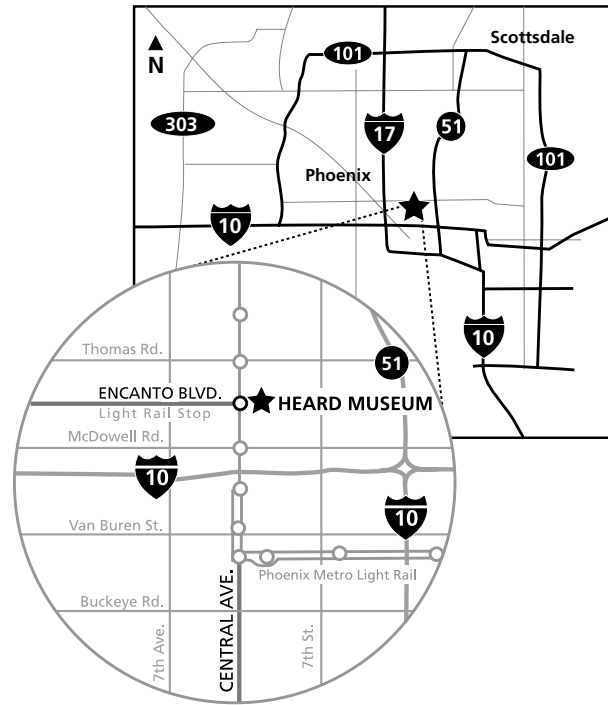

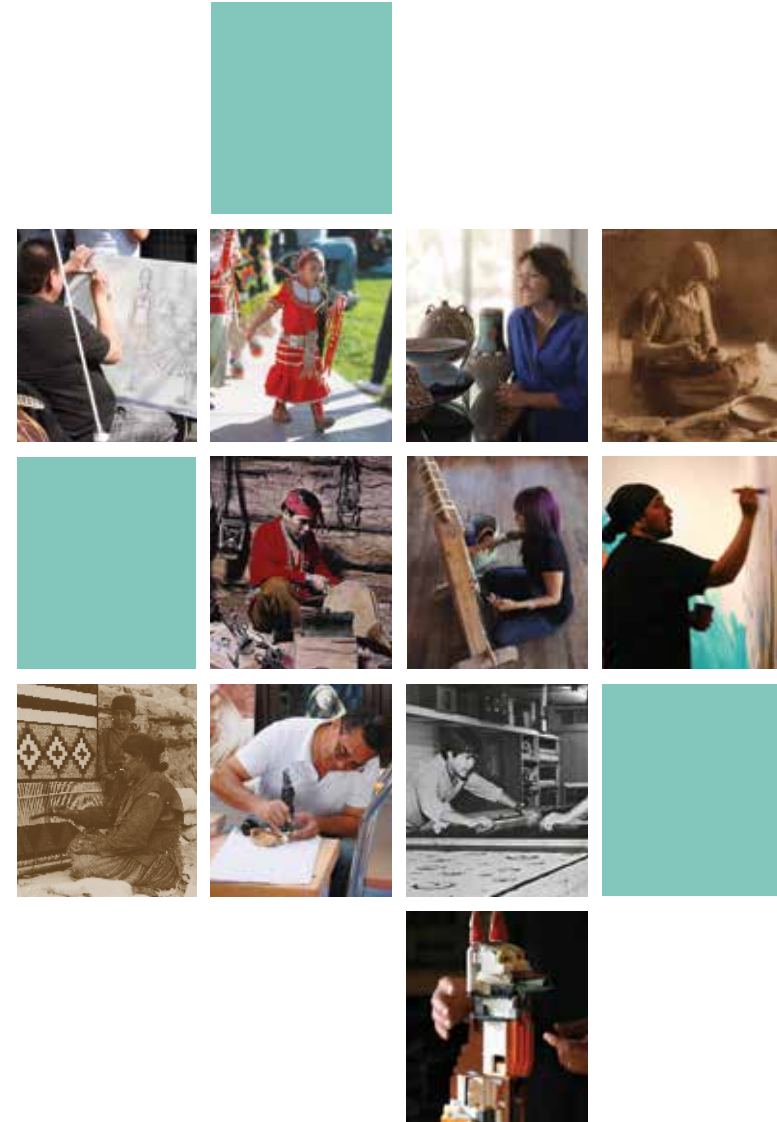

- See over 500 Hopi katsina dolls, many from the collections of Sen. Barry Goldwater and the Fred Harvey Company.
