Each Indigenous tribe, nation or community has a unique clothing style that tells us where they are from. Modern Kiowa people, now of Oklahoma, wear their traditional clothes for special occasions, ceremonies and other celebrations such as graduations and weddings. This doll's dress features traditional wear that would originally be worn in ceremony. Look at the doll on display in the Sandra Day O'Connor Gallery and take note of the beautifully made cloth dress that is decorated with shells across the chest and shoulders. Beautiful brass buckles adorn the belts and also dot down her dress. Outfits are paired with beautiful leather moccasins that are adorned with glass beads.
