**HEARD MUSEUM ANNOUNCES REOPENING PLANS WITH EXHIBITION
EXTENTIONS; MEMBERS ONLY WEEK**

Popular Heard Museum original exhibitions “David Hockney’s Yosemite and Masters of California Basketry,” “Grand Procession” and “Maria Hupfield: Nine Years Toward the Sun” extended.

(PHOENIX May 26, 20) The Heard Museum is pleased to announce its reopening timeline with new policies and procedures in place based on current guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Arizona State Department of Health.

The Heard Museum will reopen to Members June 2 - 7, 2020 and to the General Public on Tuesday, June 9, 2020.

In order to offer a safe, comfortable and enjoyable visit for guests, the museum has implemented the following procedures:

- Museum attendance will be limited to 100 per hour, max capacity 240 visitors
- Online pre-purchase admission is strongly encouraged for all visitors, save up to \$3.00 for each online ticket purchase
- Face coverings and social distancing are required for staff and visitors for all indoor spaces. Disposable masks and gloves are available upon request and free of charge
