The Heard Museum Shop first opened its doors in 1958 to serve as a place for art enthusiasts searching for authentic Native American artworks while directly partnering with Indigenous artists and supporting Native communities. Nearly 70 years later, it continues to be a meaningful part of the Heard Museum experience. The shop's commitment to working directly with Native artists aligns with the museum's mission of connecting the world to Indigenous creativity.
