DRAW A DESIGN FOR YOUR OWN PIECE OF JEWELRY!

Some Zuni (zoo-nee) jewelry is designed with special shapes, patterns, and stones. Look closely at the necklaces, bracelets, pins, and belts on display for different shapes, patterns, and stones.

What shape will it be? What will it be made of? What patterns and animals will you include? Imagine wearing your piece—what will it tell people about you?



DRAW A DOLL THAT LOOKS AND DRESSES LIKE YOU OR SOMEONE IN YOUR FAMILY.

Artists designed these dolls, which are also called soft sculptures, to celebrate a Native American tradition of making children's dolls that looked like their maker or other people in their community. These dolls are dressed in what Indigenous peoples from the Great Plains and Great Basins areas would have worn for special events.
